

## GUIDELINES FOR BLOOD DRIVES AS EAGLE PROJECTS

- Candidate handles solicitation of donors, such as directing other scouts and adults in calling/soliciting of potential donors.
- Candidate must make up advertising fliers and handle/direct the posting in public places and distribute them to the community.
- Candidate must obtain a place to put on the Blood Drive.
- Candidate should be in attendance before, during and after the blood drive.
- Candidate has to secure/direct Scouts and others in the unloading, setting up and tearing down of equipment in the Red Cross truck.
- Candidate must always be available to help out in any way during the day as needed.
- Candidate must have Scouts/others available to meet and greet and direct people as they come in to donate or help out.
- Candidate must handle the planning of a refreshment stand and must have Scouts/others assigned to working/helping out as needed.
- Candidate must show planning/leadership in raising funds for the purchase of refreshments used during the course of the day.
- The Blood Drive should not become a repetitive function done by the same Troop.
- If for any reason the project does not have the results as expected, either by low attendance in donors or poor Scout participation, the district/committee has the right to reject the completed project because it did not meet the objectives set forth in the initial proposal.
