



MAURY CLANCY INDIAN CAMBERSHIP FUND BACKGROUND

- The purpose of the Maury Clancy Indian Campership Fund is to give Boy Scouts of American Indian Heritage the opportunity to attend an approved council long-term camp program.
- The Indian Campership Fund was first created in 1971. Since its inception, the program has assisted several thousand youth in attending a council long-term camp.
- The fund was named in memory of Maury Clancy, long-time national OA committeeman, who contributed significantly to the Order. Mr. Clancy emphasized the significance of our nation's Indian culture and worked to encourage the preservation of our native heritage.
- Order of the Arrow lodges and sections may contribute "at will" to the fund thereby increasing the fund and allowing for more camperships to be awarded. Donations may be forwarded to the section, or mailed to the Order of the Arrow director.
- Campership funds will be provided for up to 50% of the cost of one (1) week at an accredited Boy Scouts of America long-term camp.
- To be eligible, a youth must be recognized as being of American Indian.
