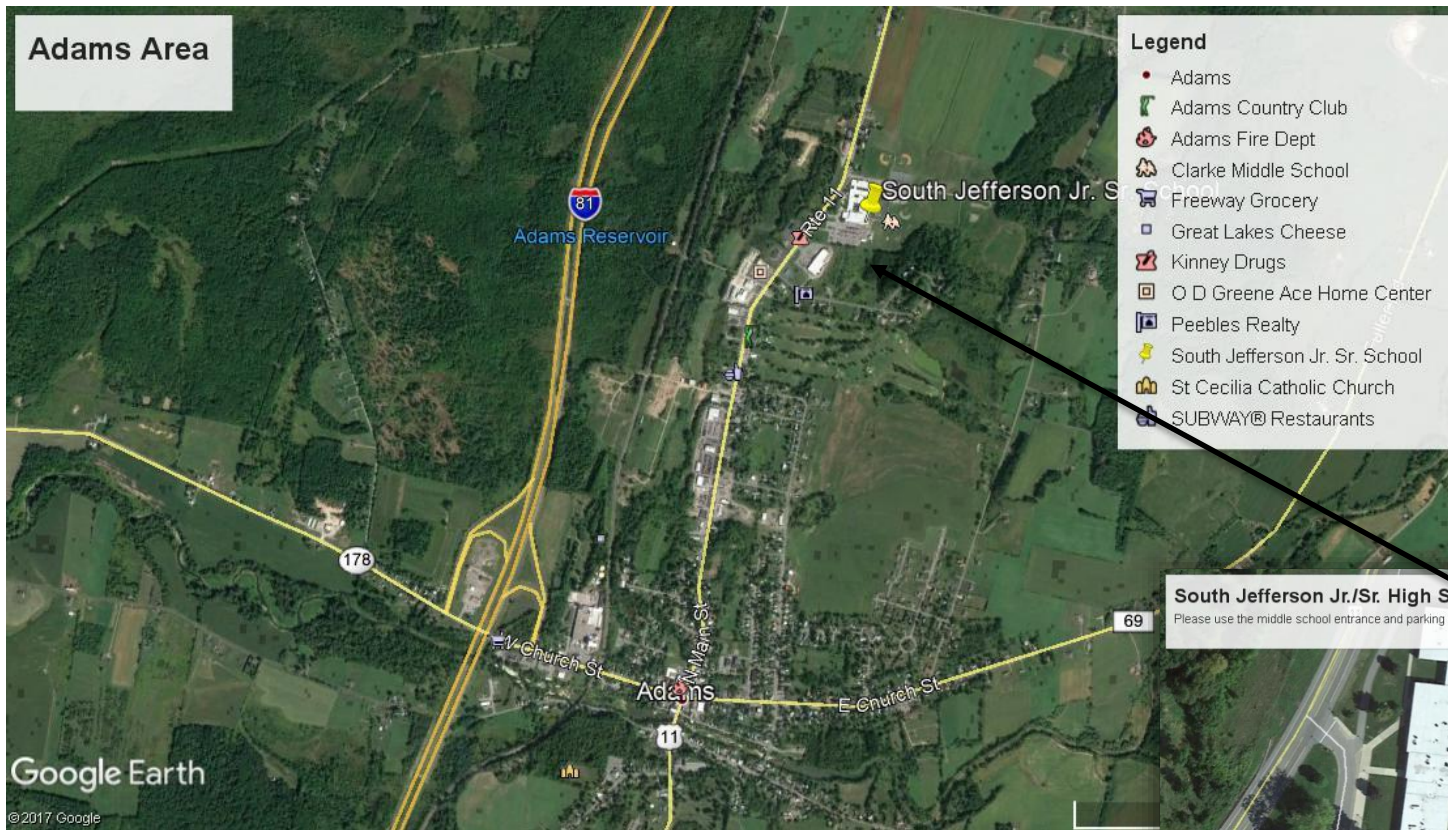

Directions from the North: Take Interstate 81 South to exit 41 (Adams exit) (See Map). Turn left off the off ramp from Interstate 81 onto Rte 178 heading into the Village of Adams. At the stop light in the Village of Adams, turn left onto US Rte 11 (N. Main Street) heading north. Stay on Rte 11 for 2.5 miles. The Jr./Sr.

School is on your right hand side just past Tops Supermarket. **Please park in the parking lot on the left hand side of the school and come in the middle entrance of the building. Please avoid the high school side of the building as there is a school play occurring the same day.**

Directions from the South: Take Interstate 81 South to exit 41 (Adams exit) (See Map). Turn left off the offramp from Interstate 81 onto Rte 178 heading into the Village of Adams. PERIOD	LEVELS	Course Name and Description
4-7	C	BSC000: Youth Protection Training: Mandatory for all Scouters to complete, the new program will be offered for those who still need to complete.
1-3	C	BSC100: Den Leader Position-Specific: This course is intended to provide Lion, Tiger, Wolf, Bear, and Webelos den leaders with the information and tools they need to conduct successful den meetings.
1-3	C	BSC101: Cubmaster & Assistant Cubmaster Leader Specific Training: This course is intended to provide Cubmasters with the information and tools they need to successfully lead a Cub Scout pack.
1-3	C	BSC102: Pack Committee Challenge: The Pack Committee Challenge is designed for pack committees and along with Youth Protection training, are the learning modules that Pack Committee Members need to be considered "trained." Please Note: <u>Pack trainers will need this course and <i>T3-Fundamentals of Training</i> to be considered "trained for their position."</u>
1-7	S	BSC103: Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmaster Leader Specific Training: This course teaches Scoutmasters and assistant Scoutmasters practical ways to instill the eight methods of Scouting into their troop programs. These methods are: The Ideals, The Patrol Method, The Outdoors, Advancement, Association with Adults, Personal Growth, Leadership Development, and the Uniform.
1-3	S	BSC104: Troop Committee Challenge: This course focuses on the core beliefs, aims, and methods of Scouting. It specifically helps each committee member learn and identify his or her role and responsibilities in support of the unit in order to provide a quality troop experience for the Scouts.
5-6	C/S/V	BSC105: Merit Badge Counselor Training: This course focuses on the purpose, policies and procedures of the Merit Badge program. A major focus will be on the duties of the Merit Badge Counselor and the role of the Scoutmaster or a designated assistant in properly administering the merit badge program in the Scout BSA troop. Recommended for Scoutmasters to take also.
6-7	S/V/Y	ELC200: How to Fly to Eagle: Many changes are happening to the Eagle process. This session prepares <u>scout leaders</u> to ensure their life scouts are ready to present themselves to the Eagle Board.
1-7	C/S/V/Y	ELC201: CPR/AED for the Adult: This course trains the lay responder to overcome any reluctance to act in emergency situations and to recognize and care for life-threatening respiratory or cardiac emergencies in adults. Upon completion of this course, you will be certified for two (2) years. Note: This course will be limited to 9 participants.
1-3	C/S/V	ELC202: Essentials in Serving Scouts with Disabilities: This presentation provides leaders and parents with the basic knowledge and skills needed to work with youth who have special needs.
5	C/Y	ELC203: Putting Pizzazz into the Pack: Pack meetings and ceremonies are meant to be FUN. This course is intended to provide you with ideas and resources to put the Fun back into pack meetings.

5	C/S	ELC204: Preparing for Crossover: This course will show you how to develop effective Pack and Troop relationships plus other strategies to ensure the successful transition of both youth and adults from Cub Scouting to Scouts BSA.
6-7	C/Y	ELC205: Derby Essentials for a Cub Scout Program: From basic planning to running a successful derby. Come and share ideas with the instructor as they take you through one of cub scouting's greatest activities.
5-7	C/Y	ELC206: Cub Scout Crafts and Games: Want to put some fun back into Den and Pack meetings? This course will show you the resources to help the Cub Scout leader to have more variety in this area and to show you that with a little effort, it's easy to do. Hands-on demonstrations will be part of this presentation. No doilies will be made during this presentation
6-7	S/V/Y	ELC208: Cold Weather Camping: For many troops and crews, the first chilly days of winter mark the arrival of camping doldrums for the outdoor program. Units otherwise skilled in camping during the fair months of the year feel unprepared to handle the more challenging camping situations of winter. This training along with the publication, Okpik: Cold –Weather Camping (available at your local Scout Service Center), provides both leadership and practical approaches for leaders wishing to bolster their camping program to a year-round one.
1-2	C/S/V	ELC209: Stem Nova Councilor Training: This course is intended to provide Nova counselors with the basic information they need to conduct successful Nova counseling sessions and activities
1-3	C/S/V	ELC210: Online Unit Management: This course will provide participants with an in depth look at how to use many of the online tools available to leaders of Pack, Troops, Crews and Ships. You'll learn about online leader and new scout registration. The new event and facilities registration system called tentaroo will be explored. Participants will explore online advancement and service hour record keeping. The my.scouting.org resource will be fully reviewed.
4	C/S/V/Y	ELC211: Ramping Up Your Popcorn Fundraiser: We will discuss the benefits of selling popcorn and how to take your popcorn selling to the next level. This training is beneficial to any unit currently selling popcorn or one that might want to take their fundraising to the next level. There are so many units out there that are scrapping together funds just to cover basic advancement let alone a quality program. This presentation will allow units to take their fundraising goals to the next level and further allow them to provide quality programming to the youth we all serve.
5-7	C/S/V/Y	ELC212: Working with Scoutbook: A look at how to work with the online program. You will be given tips, hints, and a walkthrough of the newest scout management program.
3	C/S/V/Y	ELC214: All Tied Up: Trouble tying knots? This class covers basic knots for cub scouts and scouts BSA.
5-7	C	ELC222: Tricks of the Trade For Cubs: Expand upon the basics. Learn skills to help make your pack successful including communication, organization, planning, fundraising, plus other ideas
6-7	C/S/V/Y	ELC225: The American Flag: One of the scout ideals revolves around Duty to Country. Learn the proper ways to display the American flag, fold, and ceremonies involving our flag
1-2	S/Y	ELC226: The PLC: Learn how a scout led troop revolves around a functional PLC. Involves discussions and role play.
1-2	S/Y	ELC227: Scouting and Your Resume: Learn how to incorporate your scouting experience into your resume. Also this course will include how to improve your interviewing skills.
4-5	S/Y	ELC228: Public Speaking: Provide hands on training to participants on how to enhance their public speaking skills.

1-2	S	ELC229: Conducting the Board of Review: As a committee member you need to know best practices when it comes to conducting a board of review. This course will examine all rank advancements, plus how to conduct an eagle project review for the eagle board.
7	C/S/V	ELC230: Caring for your Dutch Ovens: Many scouters are untrained on the proper care for cast iron cookware, which is one of the most expensive pieces in the kitchen. You will be shown easy and effective tips on proper cast iron care.
6-7	C	ELC290: Cub Scout Open Forum: A mediated open discussion about best practices aimed at group sharing and idea development. Come to ask questions and share your thoughts.
4-5	S/Y	ELC291: Scouts BSA Open Forum: A mediated open discussion about best practices aimed at group sharing and idea development. Come to ask questions and share your thoughts.
1-2	V/Y	ELC292: Venture Open Forum: A mediated open discussion about best practices aimed at group sharing and idea development. Come to ask questions and share your thoughts.
1-5	C/S/Y	YTH100: Den Chief Training: A Den Chief is a Scout, Venturer or Sea Scout assisting a Cub Scout den. This training combines fun and enjoyment with an excellent character building experience. Participants will learn leadership, organization and, most importantly, how to work with Cub Scouts. Prerequisites: A Scout must be a First Class Scout and be 13 years of age prior to attending Scouting University.
1-7	S/Y	YTH200: Introduction to Leadership Skills for Troops: The purpose of the ILST course is to teach Scouts with leadership positions about their new roles and how to most effectively reach success in that role. It is intended to help Scouts in leadership positions within their troop understand their responsibilities and to equip them with organizational and leadership skills to fulfill those responsibilities. ILST is the first course in the series of leadership training offered to Scouts and is a replacement for Troop Leadership Training. Completion of ILST is a prerequisite for Scouts to participate in the more advanced leadership courses National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) and the National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience (NAYLE). It is also required to participate in a Kodiak Challenge Trek. This course will be taught by Scouts who have attended NYLT and NAYLE. Class size is limited to the first 20 registered scouts. Adult leaders are encouraged to attend the course but are asked to observe only.
